Dear

Thank you for taking the time to prepare and submit written comments relative to the 18th and Northwestern Parkway storage basin project, and specifically partnering opportunities within Portland. Your comments are summarized below, and your comment sheet is attached for reference.

<u>Comment 1</u> - Please communicate plans for IOAP projects to the Portland NOW neighborhood group.

Response to Comment 1 - MSD will continue to provide information to the neighborhoods impacted by the IOAP projects. There is currently an on-going effort to reach out to residential, industrial, and commercial entities to incorporate green infrastructure into development and redevelopment projects within the CSO 190 and CSO 19 (Portland areas) basins to offset proposed basin projects. Green infrastructure provides opportunities for storm water to be diverted away from the combined sewer system and directed to more natural controls on site. A meeting with key stakeholders in Portland is being planned for July 2012. Portland NOW will be extended an invitation to this information and outreach presentation, and asked to provide comments on the plans for the area.

<u>Comment 2</u> - Please provide information on rain barrels to the Portland NOW neighborhood group.

Response to Comment 2 — There are various methods to reduce the inflow of storm water to the combined sewer system. Rain barrels, rain gardens, and other forms of green infrastructure provide opportunities for rain water to be captured, stored, treated, infiltrated, or absorbed by plants prior to running off to system inlets. These green systems are greatly encouraged, and are in some cases incentivized by MSD.

Please see the attached MSD Rain Garden manual with information on design and preferred plants for capture of rainfall, the MSD Rain Barrel Brochure, as well as the MSD Green

Infrastructure Incentives and Savings Brochure that outlines how non-residential properties can build green practices to reduce overflows. We have also attached the listing of vendors from the MSD website for rain barrels. It is important to note that many hardware and home improvement stores now have rain barrels available. Please see the attached Homeowner's Maintenance and Installation Guide for Rain Barrels for instruction on proper protocols to maximize the life and effectiveness of your rain barrel.



Rain Gardens

Rain gardens infiltrate storm water runoff by catching runoff before it reaches the storm drains. Diverting storm water into rain gardens from our roofs and other hard surfaces such as driveways or patios, helps improve the water quality of our local streams and at the same time creates functioning gardens which support biodiversity.



When sized and

constructed properly, rain gardens are able to handle the amount of storm water produced in an average event. One inch of rain, covering an average 30' X 50' roof surface = 1,500 square feet or 935 gallons of water!

MSD gathered information from other communities that are known for their rain garden programs and developed a Rain Garden Manual specifically for the

Louisville area. A 3rd Edition is now available to download (24, 5.3M) or a hard copy version can be obtain at MSD's Main Office or by calling Customer Relations at 587-0603 and requesting one.

Rain Barrels

Rain barrels collect and store rain water from your roof top to use later for watering your garden or lawn. Since introducing the concept of rain barrels in April 2006, MSD has placed approximately 400 throughout the community. Each barrel provides storage for 58 gallons of water.

Due to an increase in demand for rain barrels, MSD has partnered with a local vocational group, Louisville Youthbuild to convert the food-grade barrels into rain barrels. The process allows Youthbuild students to gain construction skills. MSD provides the barrels, parts, and adaptors for construction.

Through the Louisville Nature Center rain barrels are assembled for public sale. To assist with sale and distribution of the barrels MSD has partnered with the Louisville Nature Center (LNC) to reserve, sell, and schedule pick up times. The cost of one rain barrels is \$70, or \$65 for 2 or more barrels. Each rain barrel comes with installation and maintenance instructions. The LNC phone number is 458-1328 and is located across from the Louisville Zoo at 3745 Illinois Avenue.

While MSD doesn't promote specific rain barrel vendors, company names and contact information is being provided to assist the public in their rain barrel purchase.
